Dartmouth is need-blind* in admissions *and* guarantees to meet 100 percent of demonstrated need for all four years. In other words, we guarantee a student will not be denied admission or have to forfeit staying at Dartmouth all four years, because they can't afford it.

The need for financial aid grows each year—as does the cost. The three year average aid package for first year students was \$49,882; the average undergraduate aid package was \$49,840.
